

# DNA Learning Center Summer Opportunities!

We are looking to have 6 students employed by the DNA Learning Center over approximately 5 weeks for residential camps and workshops. The camps run from June 13 - July 15. These camps aimed at elementary through high school students and we need your help for it to be a success! While the camps are science themed no specific science knowledge is needed. A passion for STEM and working with younger students are the most important skills needed.

Training begins June 12 so you would need to move to campus June 11. The position runs from **June 11- July 16**. In order to be considered for a position, **you must be available from for this window of time.**

Primary responsibilities will be to a Resident Leader for the students (live in the dorms with them) and be responsible for planning, leading, and supervising evening activities and overnight supervision. During the day while the campers are at the DNA Learning Center, you will either assist with the labs, teaching, or lab preparation work.

Room (single room) and meals will be provided in addition to a stipend. The stipend for the 2024 summer will be \$2700. Many students go on from this to apply and serve as RAs in the future.
